

Illinois has always been a leader in transportation innovation

- In 1836 just 18 years after we became a state the Illinois & Michigan Canal linked Chicago and Lake Michigan to the Mississippi River, making Chicago the key crossroads for shipping goods.
- Illingis quickly built railroads to become the linchpin in connecting the eastern and western United States by rail.
- During the 50's and 60's, Illinois aggressively participated in the Interstate Highway program.
- With the dawn of aviation, we built one of the premiere airports in the world.

Illinois' geographical location logistically makes us the economic heart of America








Our annual investment has been declining for nearly a decade





Projects and Jobs (Source: FY 15 Capital Budget Book)




Transit and local road funding is stagnant
